Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship for Posey County ([Additional Information](#))

The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship will provide full tuition and required fees at any Indiana public or private nonprofit college or university accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North

Applications for other local scholarships will become available in January 2018.

Indiana University Wells Scholarship ([Additional Information](#))

Students planning to attend Indiana University can apply for the Wells Scholarship. The Wells Scholarship pays the full cost of attendance for four years of undergraduate study on IU's Bloomington campus. Scholars may choose to spend one of these years studying abroad through the university's overseas study programs. MVHS can nominate two students for this award. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Students may apply for the FAFSA from October 1, 2017, through March 10, 2018, for grants and loans to attend college beginning in the fall of 2018. Students and parents will sign in using a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID). A step-by-step guide for creating your FSA ID can be found at the [INvested Indiana web site](#). **MVHS will host a Financial Aid Night on October 19, at 6:00 pm, in the Media Center.** A representative from USI will present information and answer questions to help students and parents complete the 2018-19 FAFSA.

SELECTING AND APPLYING TO COLLEGE

Parchment Accounts

All seniors must create a [Parchment](#) account to request transcripts be sent to the college(s) of their choice. Click [here](#) to view a video tutorial on ordering your official transcript.

Free College Applications!

Indiana State University is waiving the application fee until October 1 for fall 2018 degree-seeking freshmen. College Go Week is September 25-29, and College Application Day is September 29. Several colleges and universities will waive application fees during this time. A list of these schools will be included in next month's newsletter.

Questions to Consider When Choosing a College

- What are class sizes?
- Is there a freshman orientation or transition to college program?
- What is the graduation rate?
- What percentage of students graduate in two/four years, depending on the program?
- What kind of student activities or organizations are on campus?
- What do students like best about this college?
- What academic or other support is offered such as free tutoring, a writing lab, counseling
- Other factors: small campus, large university, community college, living at home

Use the "[My College Choice](#)" worksheet to compare colleges/universities you are considering.

College Cost Calculators

Each college and university in the United States is required to have an updated college cost calculator, which indicates accurate current prices and fees for colleges. Use this tool to determine the cost of the schools you are considering. Many use the [college cost calculator](#) supplied by the College Board.

College Visits

Seniors have two days to visit college campuses. The deadline for approved MVHS college visits is May 1. Students need to pick up a [college visit form](#) from Mrs. Martin in the guidance office and follow the guidelines regarding attendance. Juniors can also take a college visit during the spring semester with the same approved guidelines.

Greater Evansville College Fair 2017

The University of Southern Indiana will host the Greater Evansville College Fair in the PAC Arena on Sunday, October 1, from 1:30 to 3:00 pm. Over 60 colleges and universities will be present. This year, students can register at <http://gotocollegefairs.com/> and provide their basic information and interests. This process will generate a personalized barcode that students print out or display on their phone and bring to the fair. This will eliminate the need to fill out information cards at every table.

THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Submit online or paper application to the college/university.
2. Request a transcript be sent to the college/university using your [Parchment](#) account. (See instructions to the left.)
3. Request that ACT and/or SAT scores be sent to the college/university when registering for the exam.
4. Things to have on hand when you apply:
 - GPA and class rank
 - SAT/ACT scores
 - Social Security Number
 - Email address
 - Parents' information (workplace, address, phone, etc.)
 - Dual credit (CAP) information (course number and dates enrolled)
 - AP course information, if applicable
 - Graduation date (May 25, 2018)
 - Counselor's email address:

NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE

The NCAA has implemented [online registration](#) for those students wanting to play Division I or Division II athletics in college. Use your [Parchment](#) account to request that your transcript be sent to the NCAA. The cost is \$75 (waivers are available for those who qualify). You must have your SAT/ACT scores sent directly from ACT or the College Board to the clearinghouse if you are going to play Division I or Division II athletics. Academic requirements include the following:

- Complete 16 core courses, including 10 before your senior year
- Minimum GPA in core courses must be a 2.3
- Seven of ten core courses must be in English, math, and science.

SAT AND ACT TESTS

These exams are designed to assess what you learned in high school and what you need to be successful in college. When deciding which test to take, be sure to check with the college/university you are planning to attend to see which test is required or recommended. Many colleges/universities will accept both the SAT and ACT.

The SAT and ACT are both given at MVHS (See dates to the right). Both exams can also be taken in Evansville on additional dates. On test day you must bring your calculator, admission ticket, and picture ID.

SAT Features

- Top score is 1600
- Four sections: reading, writing and language, math, and essay (optional)
- Total time: 3 hours (3 hours 50 minutes with essay)
- No penalty for wrong answers

Free SAT practice tests and other tools are available at the [Khan Academy](#) web site.

ACT Features

- Top score is 36
- Five sections: English, math, reading, science, and essay (optional)
- Total time: 2 hours 55 minutes (3 hours 35 minutes with essay)
- No penalty for guessing
- Has an interest inventory that allows students to evaluate their interests and career options
