### FAFSA

Senior students may apply for the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) from October 1, 2016-March 10, 2017. This is for grants and loans to attend college beginning in the fall of 2017.

**FSA ID** – Students & parents sign their FAFSA using a Federal Student Aid ID

### ACT & SAT:

- You must bring your calculator, admission ticket & picture ID with you on test day
- MVHS high school code is 152460.
- All tests will begin at 8:00 a.m. & the regular location is the social studies hallway at the high school.

### SAT

SAT at MVHS Saturday December 3<sup>rd</sup> and May 6<sup>th</sup>

The new SAT is still English/reading & math based.

Ways the new SAT is different:

- Top score will be 1600
- No Penalty for Wrong Answers
- Fewer answer choices
- More time for each section
- No more obscure vocabulary
- Increased use of graphs & charts
- Use of texts that are more similar to what you have seen at school
- Each question has four answer choices
- Essay is optional & revamped

## ACT

ACT at MVHS Saturday October 22 (registration deadline is September 16) and April 8<sup>th</sup> (reg deadline is March 3)

The ACT is an achievement test, measuring what a student has learned in school.

The ACT has 5 parts: English, Math, Reading, Science, & an optional Writing Test. The ACT is scored based on the number of correct answers with no penalty for guessing. The ACT also has an interest inventory that allows students to evaluate their interests & career options

## Applying for College

1. Apply to the college online
2. Go to [parchment.com](http://parchment.com) & create an account asking MVHS to send your transcript to the college of your choice

University of Evansville has announced a “guarantee in four years” for graduation or the 5<sup>th</sup> year at UE is tuition free if you have followed the academic plan. Must be full time student, maintain satisfactory academic progress, no academic or judicial sanctions. Further information at <http://www.admission@evansville.edu>

Questions to consider when choosing a college:

- What are class sizes like?
- Is there a freshman orientation or transition to college program?
- What is the graduation rate?
- What percentage of students graduate in two/four years, depending on the program?
- What kind of student activities or organizations are on campus?
- What do students like best about this college?  
What academic or other support is offered such as free tutoring, a writing lab, counseling
- Other factors: small campus, large university, community college, living at home

## Cost Calculators

Each college & university in the United States is required to have an updated college cost calculator, which indicates accurate current prices & fees for colleges. Check this out to determine the cost of your school. Many use the college cost calculator supplied by the College Board. You can find it at <http://www.netpricecalculator.org>

## College Visits

Seniors have 2 days to visit college campuses. Deadline for approved MVHS college visits is May 1<sup>st</sup>. You need to pick up a college visit form from Mrs. Martin in the guidance office & follow the guidelines regarding your attendance. Juniors can also take a college visit 2<sup>nd</sup> semester with the same approve guidelines.

## The NCAA Clearinghouse

The NCAA has implemented an online registration for those students wanting to play Division I or Division II athletics in college. You can register at: [http://eligibilitycenter.org/ECWR2/NCAA\\_EMS/NCAA.html](http://eligibilitycenter.org/ECWR2/NCAA_EMS/NCAA.html). GO TO PARCHMENT.COM AND ASK YOUR TRANSCRIPT BE SENT TO THE NCAA FROM MT. VERNON HIGH SCHOOL.

The cost is \$70. You must have your SAT/ACT scores sent directly from ACT or the College Board to the clearinghouse if you are going to play Division I or Division II athletics.

Changes in for 2016 include:

- Must have 16 core cores; 10 before senior year
- GPA in core courses must be a 2.0
- 7 of 10 core classes must be in English, math, & science.
